These are our courses!

You can choose from mavo, havo, vwo-atheneum or vwo-gymnasium, whatever suits you best. Want both practical and theoretical experience? Then De Campus might be the right choice for you. Whatever you choose, you will have plenty of time to settle in. Before the summer holidays, you will meet your class, learning coach and other teachers. At the beginning of the school year, we start with an introduction week full of fun activities. This way, you will get to know the school and each other even better.

At our school, we focus on both general education and career orientation and guidance.

Not sure which class is right for you?

No worries! Our "roof tile bridge classes" let you try two levels at the same time, for example, mavo/havo or havo/vwo.

We look at your motivation, learning style, and progress – not just your grades. Are you doing well and showing commitment? Then after the first year, you can move up to the higher level. And if that's just a little too much, then you'll be comfortable at the other level.

mavo

Mavo stands for secondary general education and lasts four years. This programme is also known as vmbo-t. At our school, you will take exams in seven subjects, so that you are well prepared for mbo (level 3 or 4) and can potentially move on to the fourth year of havo.

With this level, you will start in the first year of a mavo or havo/mavo class.

havo

Havo stands for higher general secondary education and lasts five years. After obtaining your diploma, you can go on to higher professional education or transfer to the fifth year of vwo.

With this level, you can start in the first year in a (bilingual) havo/mavo class or in a (bilingual) atheneum/havo class.

vwo

Vwo stands for preparatory scientific education and lasts six years. This allows you to progress to university. You can choose between:

- vwo-atheneum
- vwo-gymnasium

What is the difference?

The gymnasium and atheneum are of the same level. The difference lies in the classical languages: at the gymnasium, you study Latin and Greek and take your final exam in at least one of these subjects in order to obtain your gymnasium diploma. At the atheneum, you do not take these subjects. With a VWO level, you can start with us in the following transition classes:

- (bilingual) vwo-atheneum/havo
- (bilingual) vwo-atheneum
- (bilingual) vwo-gymnasium



De Campus

This Dutch-language programme combines practical and theoretical learning. Do you enjoy exploring different topics, working on themes, learning more about the world and working with others to achieve your own goals? Then De Campus is definitely for you! This programme is for curious and independent students who are good at planning and collaborating.

Whether you have a vmbo-b, vmbo-k, mavo/vmbo-t, havo or vwo level, you are always welcome at De Campus! Want to know more? Then read on on the next page!

Discover De Campus!

A new and unique programme in Eindhoven, offered only by Stedelijk College Eindhoven! De Campus is intended for curious, eager to learn, and independent students who are already able to plan and collaborate.

Develop yourself and explore the world!

At De Campus, we have a common room where you can work with your class during Campus Hours. You discuss your planning and personal growth and get to work on fun projects.



You have your own learning coach to guide and supports you. Inspiring teachers are subject teachers who teach you more about the content and depth of the subjects.

Each period, you work on a theme. All subjects connect to this theme, so it links to your world and interests. In addition to Dutch and English, you will also take French, Spanish and/or German. You will also study mathematics, biology, geography, technology, history, drama, art and music, and later on economics, physics and chemistry. Do you enjoy sports? At De Campus, you have several hours of sports and exercise every week.

At our Oude Bossche Baan location, you will discover the Skillslabs for practical subjects. You can choose from the Foodlab, Sportlab, Onstagelab, Technolab, Greenchoicelab,

Creativelab and Multimedialab. Discover which lab makes you happy!

A Campus class brings together students from all school levels. You work on themes in your own way, at your own level. This challenges you to work at your best level. Teachers inspire you, but during Campus hours you take the lead on your learning goals. By actively researching and working on your assignments, you work towards the final goals.

At De Campus, we do not give grades. Instead, we help you explore your talents and grow in many ways. We look at how you work and what you achieve, not only at the results. This way, you can develop at your own pace and do your best!

- Are you looking for more of a challenge or do you enjoy exploring?
- Are you independent, curious, able to work in a team and ready to learn how to plan?
- Would you like to work in both practical and theoretical areas?
- Do you enjoy working on themes and want to explore the world?
- Would you like a broad first year, giving you more time to show what you can do?
- Would you like to work on your own learning goals together with a coach and inspiring teachers?

If you answered “yes” to these questions, then De Campus is the place for you!



VWO at Stedelijk

At our school, you can choose between two vwo-programmes: **vwo-gymnasium** and **vwo-atheneum**. Both are equally challenging - the difference lies in the subjects.

If you choose gymnasium, you will learn the classical languages Greek and Latin. You will also dive into the world of the ancient Greeks and Romans; their culture, history and way of thinking. You can follow both vwo-gymnasium and vwo-atheneum in a Dutch-language or bilingual variant.

Learning coach

Each student has their own learning coach who helps them with planning, learning and developing yourself. Do you need more of a challenge? Then you can join special groups, such as the MHB peer group for more able and gifted students. Here you will meet others

who, like you, love to think, ask questions and discover new things..

Challenge-Based Learning

At our school, you don't just learn from books. You also work on real-world questions and projects from the world around you. We call this Challenge-Based Learning. Do you like to test your knowledge? Then you can join Olympiads or exciting competitions, even abroad.

Multilingual education

You can also learn additional languages with us, such as Chinese or Russian. And if you opt for bilingual education, at least 50% of your subjects will be taught in English. You can even take international exams, such as Cambridge English or IB (International Baccalaureate).



MUNsce

Do you enjoy debating or speaking in public? Then MUNsce is definitely something for you! You will practise debating, speaking in public and working together on global issues, just like real diplomats.

Speciaal vwo-team

We have a special vwo-team: a group of teachers who work closely together to provide high-quality education. These teachers work directly with vwo students, so they know them

well – both in terms of their learning process and personally.

Brainport Scholen

It is good to know that we are affiliated with Brainport Schools. This means that we collaborate with international companies from the region. This way, your education connects with real life and gives a glimpse of the world of tomorrow.

Bilingual education!

Does bilingual education suit you?

Do you love English and want to learn to speak the language fluently? Then our school is the right place for you! Whether you are studying at mavo, havo or vwo level, you can choose an enhanced English programme or a bilingual course with us. You will not only improve your language skills, but also develop abilities such as teamwork, presenting and critical thinking. On top of that, you'll gain unique international experiences that will broaden your horizons!

havo or vwo level

With at least 50% of your lessons in English, you will pick up the language quickly. Is your English not strong yet? No problem! You will naturally learn to read, speak and write through daily use! You will learn to present, debate, go on excursions and participate in exchanges.

The school offers a varied programme that brings the real world into the classroom through projects during lessons. You will also come into contact with people from other countries and learn about different cultures. During the programme, trips are organised to Cologne and London, among other places, and in the upper



years you can go to Italy or Spain, for example. Bilingual education (TTO) makes your school days not only educational, but also really interesting, challenging and an important step towards becoming a confident global citizen!

mavo level

We do not offer bilingual education at mavo level, but that does not mean you cannot get an extra challenge in English! You can opt for our enhanced English programme. You start with an entrance test, so we can see what suits you best. After that, you will receive one extra hour of English per week on top of that to the regular English lessons. In those extra lessons, you will work on fun projects, practise speaking and listening skills, and build your confidence.

Are you already good at English? Then we will challenge you even more. Do you find the English language difficult? Then you will be given the space to grow at your own pace. In the fourth year, you will take the Anglia Exam, which will allow you to obtain an official certificate. This certificate is a valuable addition to your future!

Did you know?

...bilingual education boosts your brainpower?

Not only do you learn English, but you also learn to think better, be more creative, plan and concentrate!

...with TTO you participate in international projects?

Sometimes you work together with pupils from other countries (and yes, that's as cool as it sounds).

....you don't have to memorise dull vocabulary lists here?

You learn English by doing things –acting, projects, discussions.

... bilingual education can have a positive influence on your future school career and career opportunities?

That dream job you have will soon become a reality.

NT2 support at Stedelijk!

Have you lived in the Netherlands for less than six years? Then you are entitled to NT2 support. Perhaps you have been here a little longer but still find the Dutch language challenging? In that case, we are also happy to help you in the TaalLokaal!

From your intake information, we can often already see how we can best support you. Sometimes it is necessary to take a test to gain a clearer picture. After that, you make your own schedule for a number of hours of NT2 support, to provide additional language support alongside your regular lessons.

We will look together at what kind of support suits you best when

it comes to the Dutch language. In addition, it is also possible to receive help with homework and study skills. In the TaalLokaal, you work in small groups with NT2 teachers to strengthen your Dutch. Our aim is to improve your Dutch as much as possible, so that you can successfully progress to your final exams. Did you know that the exams are at B2/C1 level? That is why it is so important to raise your Dutch to the highest level possible!

For NT2 pupils, we advise starting in Dutch-language education (mavo/havo/vwo) rather than in bilingual education. We recommend this because all final exams are ultimately in Dutch, and in the upper years almost all subjects are taught in Dutch.

Future-oriented education!

A welcoming school where you can be yourself

Everyone is welcome at our school, regardless of background, religion or language. We are a school with pupils from many different countries and cultures – and that makes our school warm, lively and unique. Here, you learn how to work well together, appreciate differences and discover what you have in common with others.

Personal attention for you

From the first year onwards, you will be assigned a learning coach who will get to know you well. You will regularly talk to your learning coach about how you are doing, both at school and outside of school. You will keep track of what you learn in your digital portfolio. This will help you work towards your own learning goals.

Support where you need it

Sometimes you might need some extra

support – for example, if learning is difficult for you, or if you are looking for more challenge. We offer special programmes for highly gifted pupils as well as for pupils who want to improve their Dutch language skills.

Learning at school and in the world

Of course, you learn in the classroom – but also far beyond! Think of projects, excursions, exchanges and trips. You discover how subjects are related to each other and you learn to think about important issues in the world. For example, about health, the climate or equal opportunities for everyone. The 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the United Nations are the common thread in this.

A language-friendly school

Many of our pupils speak multiple languages – and we think that's fantastic! We value all the languages spoken at our school. You can even learn additional

languages with us, such as Chinese, Spanish, Russian, French or German.

A healthy school

We believe health and wellbeing are important. With us, you will learn about sport, healthy eating, exercise and how to make smart choices. Together, we ensure that you feel good about yourself – at home and at school.

Learning coaching

At our school, you will be assigned your own learning coach who will provide you with personal guidance. You will meet regularly – sometimes briefly, sometimes for longer – to see how you are doing. Not only at school, but also outside of school. Together, you will look at your grades, how you are feeling, whether you need help with planning or studying for tests, or if you are struggling with anything. Your learning coach is your first point of contact, thinks along with you and helps you to become more independent, step by step. You will also have a three-way meeting with your parent(s)/carer(s) a few times a year. In this way, we work together to ensure that you feel seen, receive the right help and grow as a person.

'Sometimes a good conversation is exactly what you need.'

'I think it's important to really get to know my pupils. In the conversations I have as a learning coach, I often notice that pupils share just a little bit more than they do in class. You build a real connection. Recently, I had a pupil who had completely lost track. We sat down together, made a plan, and worked step by step on creating structure. That brought a great sense of calm – both for the pupil and at home. The parents were happy too, because they felt heard and involved. I always seek contact, also with colleagues, so that as a team we know what's going on and how we can help. The best thing is when a pupil says after a while: 'I'm managing again.' That's what I do it for.'

'The best thing is when a student discovers: I am allowed to be here, exactly as I am.'

'What I love about learning coaching is that I really get to take the time for a pupil. You can see someone grow when there is space to talk or to ask for help. I remember a pupil who was very insecure at first. Through our conversations – sometimes about school, but often about feelings and the situation at home – I saw her gradually blossom. She became more confident and started to enjoy coming to school. Experiencing such a change is truly special. What makes my work so rewarding? That you can genuinely make a difference in someone's life – even if it is simply by listening and being present.'

'I want to know who you are'

'For me, learning coaching is all about genuine interest. I want to know who you are, what makes you happy, and what you are struggling with. I often see that pupils mainly feel they 'have to' at the start. But over time, you notice a change: they take responsibility, dare to ask questions, and understand better what they need. That is wonderful to see. I work closely with subject teachers and parents, because the learning process doesn't stop with my conversation. We really work together. Recently, I supported a pupil who was struggling with several subjects. Through our talks, coordination with teachers and contact with the parents, that pupil found balance again. That gives me real satisfaction. It's why I enjoy this work so much.'

'You don't have to do it alone'

'In conversations, I really try to find out what you need in order to move forward – both at school and beyond. Whether it's about planning, home situations, or simply having a chance to get something off your chest – everything can be discussed. I once had a pupil who couldn't find any peace at home to study. After many talks, she finally dared to express what she needed, and together with her family we were able to find a solution. That made a world of difference. What do I enjoy most about my work? The contact with pupils and seeing their self-confidence grow. I also often consult with parents and colleagues, because together you see more. My message to you? Everyone follows their own path, so listen carefully to yourself and do what makes you happy.'

I would like to swap places with the chemistry teachers for a day, but only if they are going to do a fun experiment!

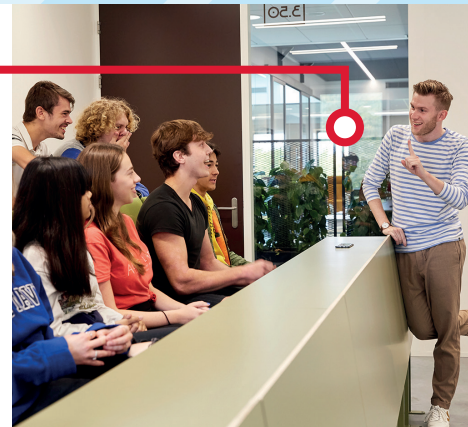
What can students always ask you?

Future-oriented sports!

Experience a unique, special and fantastic sporting experience with us! Not only the modern sports hall, but also the beautiful outdoor exercise park offer both relaxation and fun. Having fun while exercising – and keeping active in the future – is at the heart of our philosophy.



Futuristic sports hall

The sports hall consists of four sports halls that can be converted into one large hall. The floor (with LED lighting!) has fixed patterns as well as dynamic lines. At the touch of a button, the lines for playing fields can be turned on and off.

A special feature of our sports hall is the ninja course where you can test your strength. Do you like climbing? Develop your skills on our climbing wall, where you can look outside through a glass wall at a great height.

When the weather is nice, we open the glass back wall. This ensures that the indoor sports hall opens seamlessly onto the outdoor exercise park.



No grades

Future-oriented sports are important. That is why we no longer give grades for Physical Education. By exercising without grades, you will enjoy exercise more.

Green schoolyard

Outside, we have created a green oasis that is sustainable. Water treatment, heat stress prevention and biodiversity are integrated into the exercise park. In addition, there are countless pleasant spots where you can relax during breaks so that you can get back to focusing afterwards!

We encourage exercise and relaxation among pupils because it has a positive effect on your physical and mental health. We use the school playground not only for breaks and sports lessons, but also during biology, geography, history and drama lessons.

Here you will find all kinds of fun and unique features, such as the red “heart rate track” around the building where you can walk, run or rollerblade. Kick a ball around in the panna kooi, dribble and dunk on the basketball court or show off your moves on the urban dance floor. You can do it all here!

Fact

Being physically active is extremely important, as it improves your stamina, strength, speed and technique, while also strengthening your muscles and bones – helping you to stay fit. When you exercise, your body produces endorphins. These chemicals boost your mood, make you feel happier, and increase your self-confidence. That's why regular exercise is so important. Our aim is for you to enjoy being active – not only now, but also in the future!

The extras at Stedelijk!

Gifted and talented

Some pupils learn faster, think creatively and are curious about complex subjects. We call this giftedness and talent. This means not only that you pick up school subjects easily, but also that you are curious, like to be challenged and sometimes think differently from others.

We offer a special programme for these pupils. For example, you can participate in a peer group for gifted and talented pupils, where you can meet other pupils who, like you, want to think ahead. There is also the Challenge Programme: a personal and challenging programme in which you set your own goals, make choices and receive guidance to further develop your talents.

Pupils can participate on the basis of, among other things, the CBO screening, which we administer at the beginning of the school year. This screening provides insight into your abilities and helps us to tailor the education to you as well as possible. In this way, we ensure that you are not only challenged at your level, but also remain motivated and involved in your own learning process.

Language-friendly school

Language is more than just words – it is how you think, feel and connect with others. And did you know that almost everyone is multilingual? Whether you speak a different language at home, use English in games or learn a foreign language at school, multilingualism is everywhere. It not only helps you communicate better, but also makes it easier to learn, make decisions faster and understand other cultures.

As a language-friendly school, we welcome and value all these languages. We see multilingualism as a strength and actively make room for it in our education.

That's why we also offer various languages as an extra challenge, such as Chinese, extra French (DELF scolaire), Spanish (DELE) and German (Goethe). This allows you to further develop your language skills and increase your international opportunities.



Technas

In the lower years, you will take the Technas course. This is a combination of Technology, Physics and Chemistry, but in a way that relates to the world of today (and tomorrow). You will work with new technologies such as 3D printing, drones, programming, robotics, Virtual Reality and microprocessors. You will work on real projects, often together with others, and sometimes even with companies from the Brainport region, such as DAF, Philips, TU/e and ASML.

Technas is not just about theory, but above all about doing and discovering. This way, you learn step by step how technology works and how you can apply it. Everyone is welcome!

Stedelijk College Eindhoven offers many opportunities for students who need extra support or challenges. We will discuss with you, your parent(s)/guardian(s) and your primary school to see what is best for you. If you come to our school and need support, we would like to hear about it in good time. This will enable us to draw up a personal plan for you at an early stage. Ask your parents to call or email us to make an appointment quickly.

Extra help

In addition to the extra lessons, we also offer social skills training and anxiety reduction training. There is also the option of using a time-out card, and we have an Intermezzo room where you can go if you are unable to attend all lessons.

Student counselling

Your learning coach is your first point of contact, and there are also mini-coaches you can ask questions. We carefully assess each pupil to determine whether more support is needed. If it turns out that another specialist (school psychologist, school social worker or counsellor) needs to be involved, we will arrange this. Of course, we always do this in consultation with you and your parent(s)/guardian(s).

Homework assistance and tutoring

At our school, you can contact Spectrum Brabant for homework assistance or tutoring. This organisation helps you step by step with planning, learning and increasing your self-confidence. Upper school pupils also give tutoring, so there is always someone who can help you. Together, we ensure more clarity and enjoyment in learning!



Extra learning when you want it

At our school, you can take extra subjects or hours in addition to your regular timetable. You do this in your own time, at your own pace, with the help of a subject teacher.

Plus hours: extra help or challenge

With plus hours, you can get help with subjects where you need it. Or discover something new, such as Chinese or Mathematical Language. You can also learn to study smarter and more effectively to achieve your goals more easily.

Gathering subjects: dive deeper into your favourite subjects

In the upper years, you can delve deeper into subjects that you really enjoy or are good at. Perhaps you want to learn more than usual or even take exams in multiple subjects. With gathering subjects, you determine your own learning path.

For your parent(s)/guardian(s)

We believe it is important for parent(s)/guardian(s) to be involved and encourage good cooperation between school and home. That is why we organise several meetings throughout the school year. Do you have any questions in between? Then there is always room for an extra appointment!

Contact moments

At the beginning of the school year, we organise an introductory evening where your parent(s)/guardian(s) can meet the learning coach and other parent(s)/guardian(s). Just like for you, the learning coach is the first point of contact if there is anything to discuss. In addition, there are three contact moments in a school year, during which there is a meeting between your parent(s)/guardian(s), your learning coach and you, which we refer to these as three-way meetings. There are also always opportunities for teacher-parent meetings, where your parent(s)/guardian(s) can ask questions about specific subjects.

Student tracking system

Our school uses SOMtoday as its pupil tracking system, which allows you and your parents to view your timetable, homework and grades. They can also use this system to notify us of medical appointments.

Parents/guardians can also be actively involved with us!

Many parents/guardians enjoy working with us. There are two ways to do this:

Resonance group (RG)

Parents who would like to contribute ideas about our education can join a resonance group. Three times a year, they discuss educational matters. This is a great way to work together to improve education at our school.

Parent Council (PC)

The PC meets monthly with the school management and a delegation attends the RG meetings. In addition, they regularly organise information evenings for parents/carers and colleagues on social issues such as social media, the dangers of lover boys or bullying.



“As a member of the Parents’ Council, one of the most important tasks is to consult with the school management about current matters. By meeting monthly, you ensure that the voice of parents is heard and that we can take part in decisions on issues that are important for the school. In addition, the Parents’ Council is also present at RG meetings, where we meet teachers, other parents and learning coaches. After these meetings, we share parents’ viewpoints and provide feedback to the management team.

The school allocates part of the voluntary parental contribution to the Parents’ Council. With this, we finance, among other things, themed evenings and small tokens of appreciation for special occasions, such as diploma ceremonies. In this way, we are involved on behalf of all pupils and their parents. Moreover, as a Parents’ Council we have the freedom to give unsolicited advice. By sharing your perspective as a parent, you can offer valuable insights and contribute to a better school experience for all pupils.”

Our building!

The building has been designed to be sustainable. We heat and cool it using a natural source, so that the temperature inside is always pleasant. There are no fewer than 1,150 solar panels on the roof. These provide the energy we use. The entire building is energy neutral: good for you and good for the world.

There are workspaces throughout the school. This means you can work quietly on a presentation, homework or project in many different places.

At the heart of the school is the library. This is a quiet and pleasant place where you can read, collaborate or work in silence. Whatever you prefer. You will quickly feel at home with us — thanks in part to the building!

At our school, it's not just about learning, but also about feeling comfortable. That's why the learning areas are designed so that you can relax, work or just chat with friends. Practical information!

TOP weeks

Four times a year, we have a TOP week. TOP stands for Tests and Projects. During these weeks, you take important tests or work on larger assignments. You know well in advance what to expect, so you can prepare yourself properly. Outside of the TOP weeks, there are also occasional tests or oral assignments. Sometimes you do these alone, sometimes with the whole class. This helps you keep up and learn to plan and study more effectively.

Voluntary parental contribution

The parental contribution is voluntary and is used for fun activities, such as class trips, school parties and excursions. In addition, we ask for a voluntary contribution for some extra activities we organise, such as special educational programmes, trips and exchanges. Paying this contribution is not compulsory, but it is appreciated. With this contribution, we can make education even more enjoyable and challenging for everyone. For some subjects, such as Physical Education or Art, there may be additional costs for special activities or materials. For bilingual education, there may also be costs for exams or extra activities. If parents wish to pay the contribution, they can do so in one payment or in instalments. For the trips and exchanges we organise, we provide the costs in advance so that you know exactly what you are paying for.

Items to purchase

New pupils must purchase their own laptop. We work with a reliable partner to ensure that you can buy a laptop at an affordable price and with the right specifications. You will receive more information about purchasing the laptop once you have been definitively admitted. Together with VanDijk, we will ensure that the correct school books are ordered for you. We will order the books for you and have them delivered to your home, so that you have the right materials without having to worry about it.

In addition to your laptop, there are a few other items that you will need to purchase yourself, such as a calculator, set square and pens. Teaching materials that everyone in the class uses, such as an atlas or dictionary, are available at school. It is also important that you have good sportswear and trainers. Your sportswear should be comfortable so that you can move freely, and your trainers should be suitable for indoor and outdoor sports.

At home or in the locker

We do not use phones, smartwatches, tablets or earphones anywhere at school – neither inside the building nor outside on the school grounds. This way, we can all enjoy a more peaceful and pleasant environment. If you do bring these items, they will be collected and you can pick them up at the end of the day. Do you like to study during break time? Then

you can use your Chromebook in the designated areas in the school.

The facilities team is there for you

Do you need a bicycle pump, a plaster, or have you lost a key? Or do you just want to have a friendly chat? Our facilities team – known as Team Blue – is always there for you. They are the first to arrive at school and make sure that everything is in order, even when the school building is closed again after the pupils have gone home.
